7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Handling is performed in a well ventilated place. Wear suitable protective equipment. Be careful not to cause leakage, overflow, or dispersion. Steam should not be generated unnecessarily. Keep away from heat/sparks/open flame/hot surfaces. -No smoking. Take measures to prevent the build up of electrostatic charge. Use explosion-proof equipment. Avoid shock and friction. Wash hands and face before breaks and immediately after handling the product. Use a closed system if possible. Use a local exhaust if dust or aerosol will be generated. Avoid all contact!
